Being in the heart of Silicon Valley, it's important that our campus spaces reflect the technology-driven ethos of the region and that our students are prepared for tomorrow's careers. President Teniente-Matson recently announced that we will be assessing and developing a plan to upgrade our classrooms and future-proof our technology. Our university will be creating a strategy roadmap based on the needs of our students, faculty, and staff in classrooms and all teaching and learning spaces across our campus. We must equip our university learning spaces to empower the education experiences of future pedagogies. To lay the groundwork for a broader transformation, this project will begin with a high-level 10-week assessment.

The Learning Space Upgrade and Academic Technology Strategy (LSUATS) initiative will begin with a 10-week project, launching in early September and concluding in November. Deloitte will collaborate with students, faculty, staff, stakeholders, and pedagogy experts to conduct a thorough current state assessment, develop a strategic vision and plan for the future, and create a multi-year implementation roadmap.
