


Viewing and grading Turnitin submissions

This documentation describes how to view, comment and grade Turnitin enabled assignment submissions.

Steps to be followed:

1. Go to your grade book in Canvas by clicking on Grades on the left hand pane. Here you will see all the assignments, the list of students and their grades on those assignments.

2. Click on the name of the Assignment which is Turnitin enabled. It will have a small grey comment balloon to notify that Turnitin results are available on the assignment. The turnitin assignment with the gray balloon is highlighted with the red rounded rectangle in the image above.

3. The assignment now opens. On the right hand side of the screen you will see “Speedgrader” as is highlighted with red in the image below.

Landon Winner's Three Guiding Maxims

In the focal engineering venture of the engineering project, it is the product of the engineering project that stands out. Even though the engineers who design a product are fair and honest, the process that results in the product is ethically correct; the product might still have a deadening effect on its eventual end user. Whether we are looking at a specific product or a specific practice employing that product, product, person or persons, and world should be brought into consonant focus. An ideal instance of focal engineering needs to engage all involved parties in constructing a narrative within the conversation of the lifeworld regarding any new or proposed technology. Landon Winner offers us three guiding maxims about how to focus life world conversations:

1. No innovation without representation. All affected get a voice.
2. No engineering without political deliberation. And that would necessitate ethical and social deliberation as well. Who gets what and why are questions that need to be addressed.
3. No means without ends. Clearly established and meaningful goals need to be discussed and agreed upon before any design, development, production, or distribution gets under way.

The last guiding maxim that Winner takes about is “No means without ends.” These days, we find that technologists see forced into the general public. These can be viewed as “Tech




- On the right hand side of the screen you will see a turnitin similarity index (shown with red highlight in the image below) under Submitted files. Clicking on it will take you to the Turnitin page.



- The turnitin page will show the assignment text, the similarity index and the plagiarized text annotations in red.




7. To add comments to the paper, click on the “Grademark” tab (marked with red ellipse in the image above) on the top of the webpage. The Grademark screen shows all the commonly used comments on the right hand side in blue.



8. Commonly used comments can be seen under “Commonly Used”. These can be dragged and dropped on the assignment. After dragging and dropping, additional comments can be added by clicking on “Edit”.

9. Voice and text comments for the entire paper can be added by clicking on the general comment tab (the second tab on the bottom right of the page).



10. To print/ download the paper with the Turnitin annotations, click on “Print/Download” on the bottom left corner of the page.  Click on “Download PDF of current view for printing”.
