

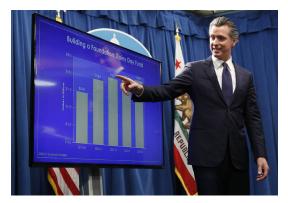


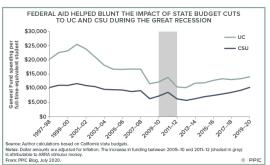

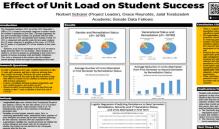

The 2020 Context























- Impacts from COVID-19 & resulting recession are going to be felt for many years
- We should NOT plan to get additional State funding for some time
- Campuses are viewed (by Sacramento & Unions) to have large reserves
- CSU is NOT planning a furlough for 20/21
 - Note that only the System can announce Furloughs
 - Campuses only have the ability to do layoffs
- Each CSU individual campus has very different issues / solutions
 - Enrollment / Reserves / County Health / Athletics / Leadership

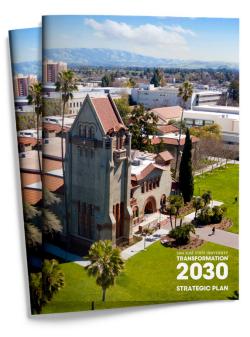

\$92M problem



- State reduction (\$18.6M)
- Enrollment Impacts (\$16M)
 - Loss of 500 Non-residents (\$8.5M) and 655 Residents (\$4.2M)
 - Average Unit Load Increases (\$1.1M)
 - Special Enrollment Allocation (\$2.2M)
- Mandatory Costs (\$2M)
- COVID-19 Impacts (\$43.7M)
- Transformation 2030 (\$12M)
 - Faculty Recruitment
 - Investment in Research and Innovation Infrastructure
 - Various Initiatives (Faculty Startup, Website, Diversity Positions)

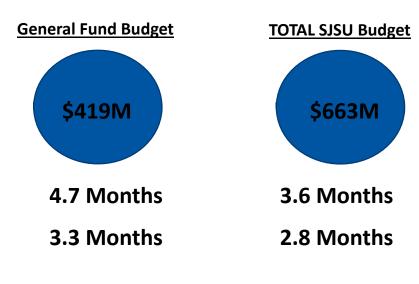




Months of Reserves

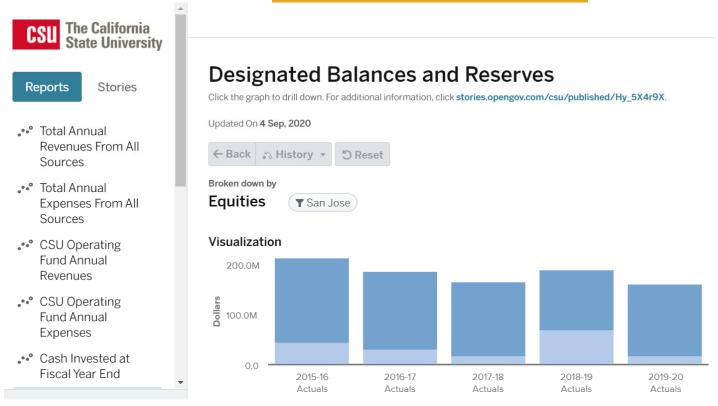

- Reductions are on the NET Reserves remaining
- FY21/22: 40% Reserves Remain
- FY22/23: ONE month of Fungible Reserves

This model assumes no new financial challenges. If there are further reductions to state or federal funding, SJSU will need to be even more creative about how to close the gap.

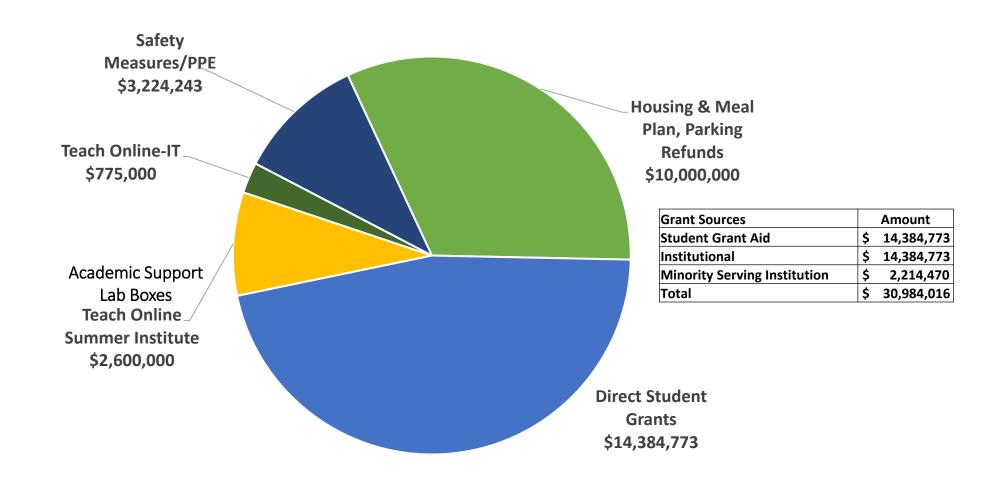

CARES Act (HEERF) Distribution Plan







- Federal Cares from 19/20 applied (\$16.5M)
 - Housing/Dining/Parking (\$10M)
 - Academic Affairs (\$2.6M)
 - IT / FD&O (\$3.9M)
- Reserves Usage (\$59M)
 - "Push to Center" Beginning Balances
 - Includes Auxiliary contributions
- Division Reductions (\$6.2M)
- Hiring Chill for 4+ months (\$8.7M)
- Travel restrictions (\$2.6M)
- Program deferrals (\$2.7M)



Operating Fund Expenditures by Division 2020/21 Budget

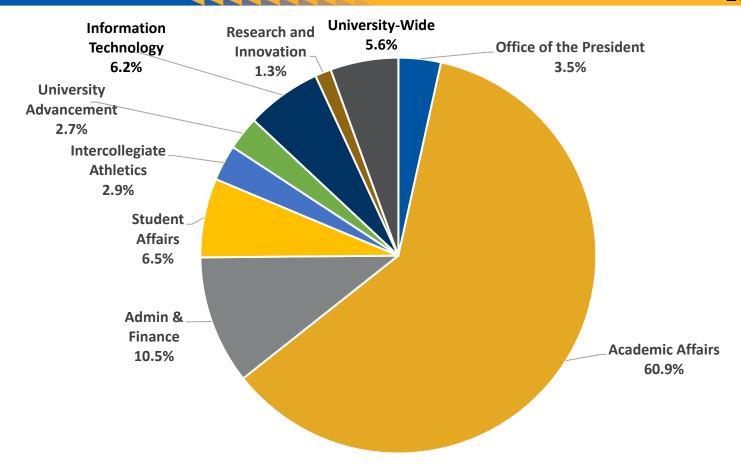
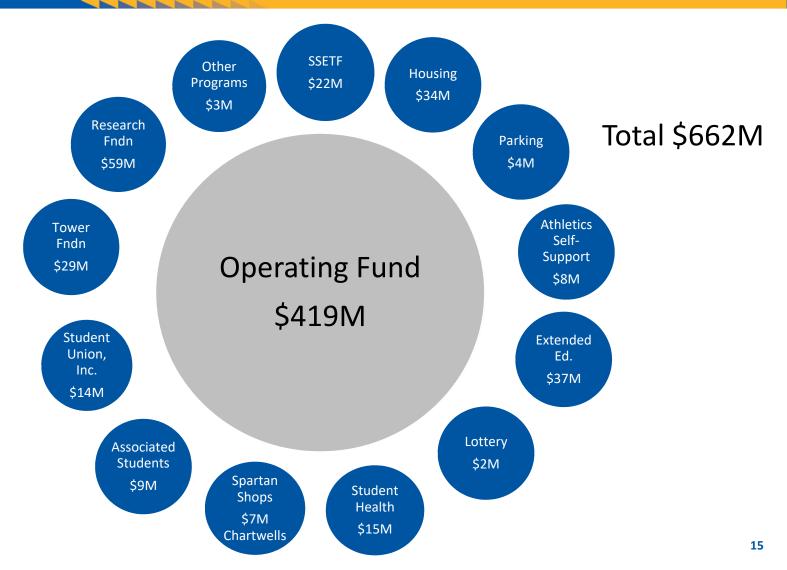


Chart above displays the breakdown of the Operating Fund base expenditure budget. Budget excludes Restricted Student Aid (primarily a U-Wide tuition discount). Employee benefits have been estimated for all Divisions at a rate of 48%. More details are available in the Annual Budget Report (p. 11).

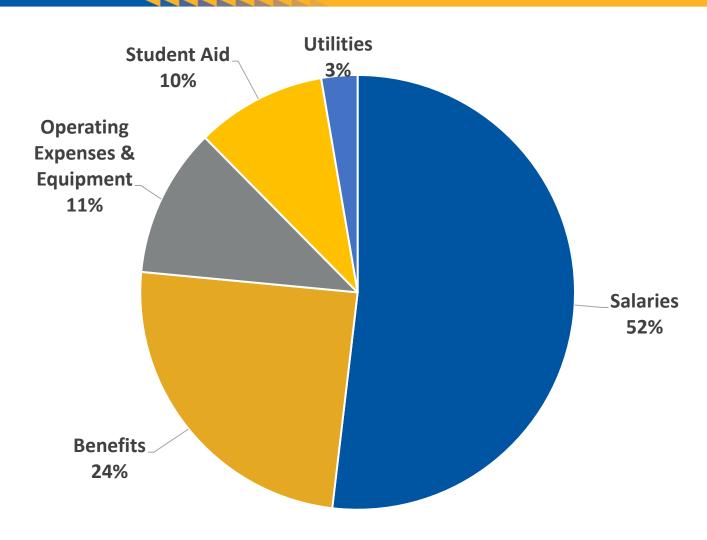


SJSU Expenditure Budgets



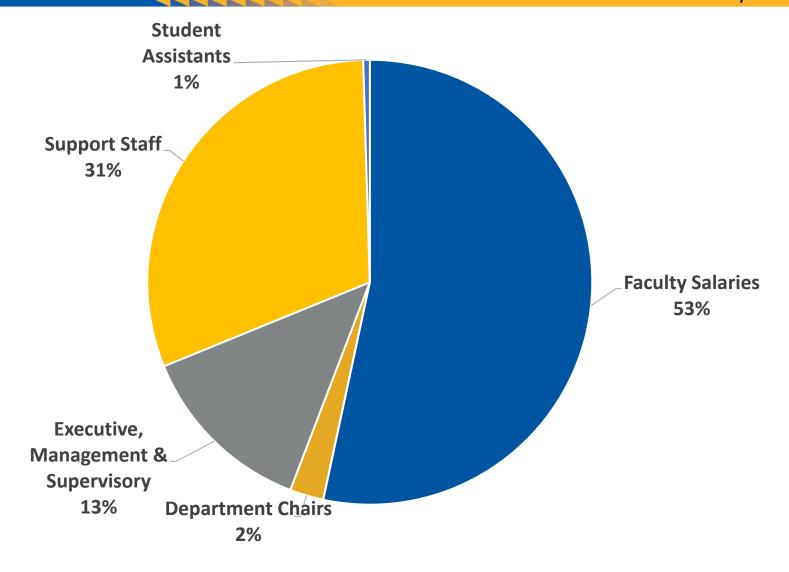


Breakdown of Operating Fund Expenditures 2020/21 Budget
