ACADEMIC COUNCIL POLICY RECOMMENDATION #S73-3

At its meeting of February 5, 1973, the Academic Council passed the following amendment to the Interim Retention, Tenure and Promotion Standards and Procedures, as presented by Dr. Theodore Norton.

RESOLVED, That the Interim Retention, Tenure and Promotion Standards and Procedures, paragraph II-B-5, be amended to read as follows:

5.--The-intensity-of-the-evaluation-process-will-vary-in-accordance with-the-academic-position-of-the-faculty-member.--Thus-granting-of tenure-requires-stronger-evidence-of-worthiness-than-appointment; promotion-to-Professor-requires-a-more-rigorous-application-of standards-than-promotion-to-Associate-Professor,-ete;

5. As a general rule, the scope of evaluation and weight of evidence required to support a favorable personnel recommendation will increase with the significance of the decision. Normally, a tenure decision is considered more significant than appointment, promotion more significant than a merit salary adjustment, and promotion to Professor more significant than promotion to Associate Professor.
