At its meeting of March 30, 1987, the Academic Senate approved the followir Policy Recommendation presented by Ruth Yaffe for the Curriculum Committee.

COMPETENCY IN WRITTEN ENGLISH FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS

Amends UP F81-8.

WHEREAS

In May, 1976, the Board of Trustees adopted a resolution endorsing "the principle that all students entering CSU after implementation of the proficiency/diagnostic examination be required to demor strate their competency with regard to writing skills as a require ment for graduation," therefore be it

That this policy shall be implemented in the following manner: RESOLVED

- The establishment of English competency shall be a requiremer of Classified Graduate students as a condition necessary fo advancement to candidacy for the award of the Master's Degree.
- Competency shall be established by:
- a. Satisfactory completion of the CSU baccalaureate gradua tion requirement of competency in written English; or
- b. Satisfactory completion as a Graduate student of the Sa Jose State University undergraduate upper division writing require ment by passing the writing workshop waiver examination or complet ing satisfactorily a writing workshop; or
- c. Satisfactory completion of a Graduate course of at leas three units in which a major report is required (such report to) valued at a minimum of thirty (30) percent of the course grade; The courses meeting this requirement shall be evaluated by th Graduate Studies Committee for the amount of writing and the leve of competence required.
- d. Approval by the Graduate Studies Office of a profession: publication for which the candidate was principal author; and be : finally

That the implementation of this policy shall begin with the sprin RESOLVED. semester, 1988. This policy shall apply to all students wi achieve Classified Graduate status after September 1, 1987.
