S90-9 Minimum Grades to Fulfill ELM and EPT Requirement

Legislative History:

At its meeting of May 7, 1990, the Academic Senate approved the following Policy Recommendation presented by Sandra Kajiwara for the Curriculum and Research Committee.

ACTION BY THE UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT:

"Approved and accepted as University Policy, Effective Fall, 1990 and thereafter." Signed Gail Fullerton, May 14, 1990.

- Whereas, San José State University requires, through the use of A,B,C,NC grading, that its native freshmen achieve a grade of "C" in SJSU English 1A before entering English 1B, but requires transfer students only a "passing" grade in English 1A or equivalent (which may be a "D"), and
- Whereas, Transfer students who have passed a Community College Quantitative Reasoning course with a grade below "C" must, by CSU policy, <u>take</u> the Entry Level Math (ELM) exam -- but do not need to <u>pass</u> it, and
- Whereas, On most CSU campuses, passage of the ELM exam has been made a graduation requirement (partly in order to address the illogic of the above scheme), therefore, be it
- Resolved, That SJSU establishes as a graduation requirement a minimum grade of "C-" in English 1A (or equivalent course), and be it further
- Resolved, That SJSU establishes as a graduation requirement passage of the ELM examination and a minimum grade of "C-" in the course used to satisfy the CSU General Education Quantitative Reasoning requirement.
