

ENTREPRENEURSHIP



The Entrepreneurship Concentration prepares students who have a drive for innovation and the passion to create a new business or add value to an existing business. Students who complete the program will develop an understanding of the key management principles across business functions, and learn how they are applied in the creation and growth of new ventures. They will gain an international perspective of entrepreneurship, and the factors underlying the emergence of global startups. Students have the opportunity to gain hands-on experience of entrepreneurship by working closely with a startup or working on launching their own ventures. The program qualifies candidates to start their own business by building on a new "idea" or to join many of the entrepreneurial companies in Silicon Valley.

What Entrepreneurship Students will Learn

Students will develop entrepreneurship-specific skills such as opportunity recognition, analyzing the feasibility of a startup idea, engaging in customer development, and constructing business models. They will also develop business skills of working in diverse, multi-disciplinary teams, persuasive communication, critical thinking, and problem solving. They will be able to apply business knowledge gained from multiple disciplines, including marketing, finance, management, and operations, to recognize, analyze, and articulate strategies for promoting creativity and innovation in the context of entrepreneurship.
